

Green Bridge Project

The Green Bridge walkway is a Salado landmark for residents and visitors alike. Over the years the garden area has been cared for by different volunteer groups, and in 2010 Keep Salado Beautiful accepted the challenge.

Through a partnership with Master Naturalists, Central Texas Chapter, and help from local volunteers the bridge garden has been refreshed and native plants added.

Also new along the Green Bridge walkway is a beautiful sign describing the value of native plants in Texas landscapes. KSB is grateful for partnership with the Eagle Prints class at Salado High School for the sign design.

Among the native plants you will find in the Green Bridge Garden: mealy blue sage, columbine, wine cup, big muhly, lantana, turk's cap, American beauty berry, zexmenia, Jerusalem sage, autumn sage, fall aster, cedar sage, coral berry, bush germander, rough-leaf dogwood, Mexican buckeye, Texas mountain laurel and redbud.
